Fotofever: A snapshot

The photographic fever is here for the fifth time!

The Carrousel du Louvre welcomes the international photography fair from the 14th to the 16th of November, 2014.

An inimitable Parisian event during the Mois de la Photo, it presents the opportunity to capture a young, creative generation, soaring in popularity amongst collectors.

Fotofever's mission: to promote the discovery, encouragement and development of artists through the acquisition of their works.

The aim: to encourage young generations, passionate about photography – a medium of communication par excellence – to inspire new collectors and to share the collector's fever.

Catch the fever, collect photography!

The temperature rises: For fotofever's 2014 edition, a selection of over 100 international galleries – compared to only 60 last year – will take the limelight. This year, the continually evolving fair has appointed a committee to approve the quality of selected galleries: it is comprised of l'Association des Galeries d'art Paris – represented by its co-president Baudoin Lebon – and Belgian collector Galila Barzilai Hollander. Notable Chinese and Japanese galleries partaking in the event include 798 Photo, Emon Photo and Zen photo, whilst Northern Europe is represented by the presence of Galerie Hiltawsky and In The Gallery. Over half of the galleries participating in the fair specialise in photography.

More than ever before, this photography art fair positions itself as the emerging platform for those wishing to discovery the artists of tomorrow.

Cultivating careers with fotocollection: finding a private collection with a captivating theme.

Starting a collection with collect foto: a free guide offering advice on the acquisition of photography.

Artworks in the foreground with start to collect: defining the highlight of each exhibitor's stand to make their collection stand out.

Revisiting the classics with Harcourt: the acclaimed studio celebrates its 80th anniversary at the fair.

fotocollection: collectors set the tone

As in previous years, fotofever offers an insight into the secret of collecting. Galila Barzilaï Hollander presents her vibrant and diverse collection: awe-inspiring photographs from international artists.

Her journey began ten years ago: luck led her to the Armory Show in New York, which in turn resulted in her first purchase of a contemporary artwork.

Today she owns several thousand works, predominantly in new photographic mediums, which focus on themes such as eggs, chairs, paper, as well as concepts such as “détournement”, reappropriation and recycling. A number of pieces are on display until September 7th at the exhibition entitled “A book between two stools” at the Boghossian Foundation in Brussels.

Her collection is her family, and her works are her children. Galila became an “artoholic” without any particular knowledge of contemporary art, using feeling rather than insight. She quotes Bill Viola: “Don’t think about art – live it!” She takes great pleasure in discovering unknown artists who are both promising and accessible.

Galila advises potential collectors to “Buy what you love! Buy with instinct!”

It is this passion which has the potential to awaken the hidden collector within. Find it at fotofever!

fotoprize: young graduates take the foreground

fotofever organises fotoprize, a prize open to students and young graduates from French art schools. The jury, comprised of Nathalie Gallon, Director of the Carmignac Photojournalism Award ; Guy Boyer, Chief Editor of the Connaissance des Arts magazine ; Philippe Assalit, artist present in Galila's collection ; and Jean-François Camp, CEO of Laboratoire Central Dupon Images joined on June 12th and nominated **Laure Fauvel** as laureate of the prize. The artist has the opportunity to exhibit at fotofever, with the support of Central Dupon Images, partner of the event.

Laure Fauvel takes inspiration from the fantastic and the unreal. After three years spent at lcart Photo, she chose to study post production photography at Les Gobelins. The works of artists such as Guido Mocafico or Julia Hetta have a great influence on her works.

The jury were particularly taken by Laure's series Cévennes. Half-light photographs, a range of brown tones, a perfect mastery of lighting, a particular feeling. The images captivate and the spectator is transported.

collect foto: turning the page

How and why to buy? In order to share its commitment to the purchase of photographs, fotofever has created a guide to help remove the obstacles that can get in the way of acquisition. This guide, available in French and English, includes a glossary of key terms, a brief history of photography, market trends, taxation information, a profile of the private Galila collection and fototips for buying photographs. An ideal tool for young collectors, the guide will be handed out for free to all visitors to fotofever.

The guide is written in collaboration with Art Media Agency (AMA), an international news agency focused on the art market, which will also advertise the guide to its 150 000 subscribers.



A catalogue is also available to the public, edited in partnership with Snoeck publishers.

Start to collect: a collection in mind

Fotofever accompanies young collectors, offering the “start to collect” trail, with each stand featuring a work that is ideal for starting a collection. Marked by red stars, these works do not cost more than €1000 – for example, Sit Down gallery offers a piece by photographer Alisa Resnik at €900 (6.ex).

Harcourt: capturing the inimitable

Studio Harcourt celebrates its 80th anniversary this year. Since 1934, it has photographed the greatest French and international stars of the world of art, cinema, industry and politics in an inimitable and identifiable style. For fotofever 2014, Harcourt exhibits a series of legendary portraits, featuring Barbie, Pushpamala N and Bertrand Lavier. These shots will be on sale exclusively at fotofever.

On the occasion of this anniversary, publishing group La Martinière are publishing a work with a preface by Dominique Besnehard, present at the event. Finally, the Harcourt photo booth at the fair will make every visitor the star of the show.

798 Photo Gallery opened in 2003. As the first art gallery dedicated to photography in China, it represents around 50 classical and contemporary photographers – the majority of whom are Chinese –, illustrating the changes to have taken place in China over the last 20 years.

Nap Gallery, Japan, Tokyo

Since 2011, Nap Gallery has promoted the work of young, contemporary Japanese artists to the public.

Solo show: Honjo Noaki

Born in 1978, the young photographer was awarded the Ihei Kimura prize, one of Japan's most prestigious photography awards. Honjo Noaki photographs real-world entities to look like toys and models. None of his images are digitally altered and one photograph may take several days to realise.

Emon Photo Gallery, Japan, Tokyo

Opened in 2005, Emon Photo Gallery exhibits the work of mainly Japanese photographers across different generations. It places emphasis on the discovery and nurturing of up-and-coming practitioners, such as : Muga Miyahara, Ryoichi Suzuki and Koji Onaka. The gallery, which has previously exhibited at fotofever, defines itself as a representative of contemporary Japanese photography.

Studio Akka, South Korea, Gumi / Italy, Milan

This Korean contemporary art gallery, specialising in photography and design, was opened in 2012. It has recently opened a space in Italy, with a view to promoting Korean artists. In the same vein, works by young Italian artists are exhibited in Korea.

Solo show: Sung Yeonju

The Korean artist creates haute couture fashion garments out of fruit and vegetables, immortalising these creations through photography.

The work of Galerie Vevais – specialist photography publisher since 2006 – is wholly unique. Alexander Scholz notably publishes books in collaboration with craftsmen, often in signed and numbered limited editions. Containing works of art, his books are themselves artworks, and have been present on numerous editions of fotofever.

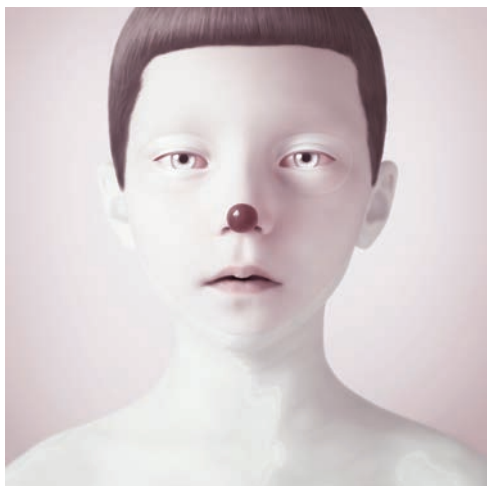

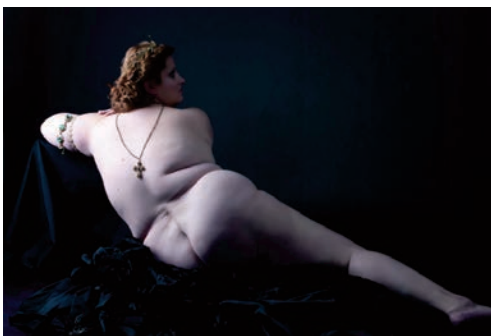

Spot U Art, Belgium, Brussels

Spot U Art is a young online contemporary art gallery, created in 2013 by Alexia Verrie, contemporary art curator. She offers a platform for recognition and visibility to emerging European artists, aspiring to promote new talent. The gallery presents an exclusive selection of paintings and limited edition, high quality photographs. Online purchasing presents numerous advantages, amongst these: accessibility, lower prices and less time spent on acquiring a work of art.

Florence d'Elle is a self-taught Belgian photographer. Photographing women from all walks of life, her models represent the multiple facets of what the artist calls the "Universal Female".

Since 1996, these archives of Italian photography, focused on landscape, demonstrate a visual appreciation of Italian culture, assembling works by highly-acclaimed photographers, alongside highlighting emerging talent. It aims to create a comprehensive collection dedicated to contemporary Italian photography. Afi Fotoarchivio also organises a festival in Castellanza and participates in numerous international events, such as photography festival Les Rencontres d'Arles.

Galerie Baudoin Lebon, Paris

The gallery was opened in 1976 and is particularly focused on traditional and contemporary photography. It represents a number of photographers, including: Joël Peter Witkin, Patrick Bailly-Maitre-Grand, Mathieu Bernard-Reymond, and Peter Knapp. It also features sculpture, installation art, painting and drawing, by acclaimed artists such as Dubuffet, Fièvre and Michaux.

Solo show: Jacques Livet

Having photographed extensively in Paris, his photographs act as a testament to the changes in the medium during the 1940s. Influenced by Surrealism, as a result of his relationship with his brother Roger, he took a number of photographs reflecting this, exhibited for the first time at fotofever.

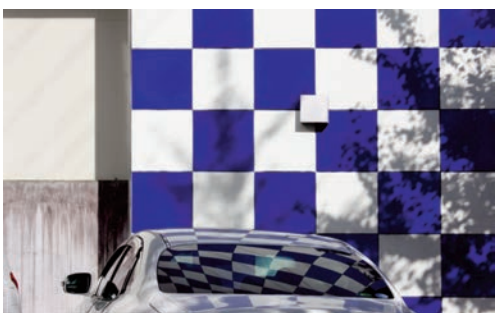

The gallery also presents exhibitions online.

Born in Venice in 1956, Alassio has been a professional photographer since 1984. His artistic works seek to represent the unseen, with variously-inspired themed series giving form to an otherwise abstract world. In New York, Alassio is represented by Barry Friedman Gallery, and has also exhibited at the city's MoMA.

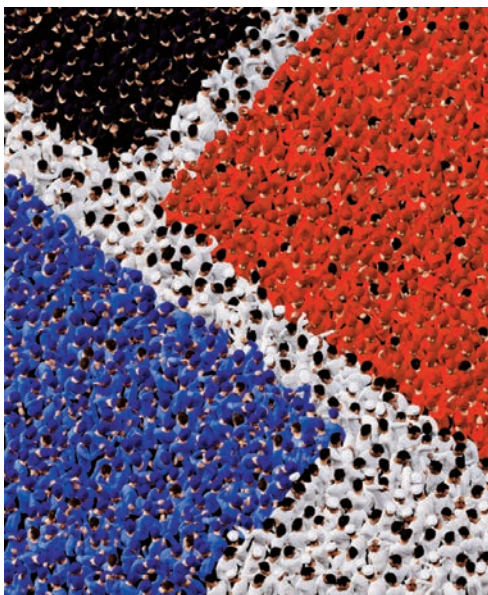

Die Maurer was established in 2010 and presents contemporary artists from Tuscany and from all over the world, with the aim of promoting young talented artists working with all art forms. The hanging of artworks often makes their exhibitions look like a private collection.

Founded in Turin in 2003, Sabrina Raffaghello Arte Contemporanea initially focused on work by emerging and established Italian artists. Today, the gallery represents an international selection of photographers, including a number of Chinese artists, and video artists. Having recently moved to Milan, the gallery expanded to Amsterdam in 2013, opening the Red Stam Gallery. The gallery has participated in fotofever since 2012.

Specialising in Contemporary photography, Little Big galerie opened its Montmartre space in 2010. 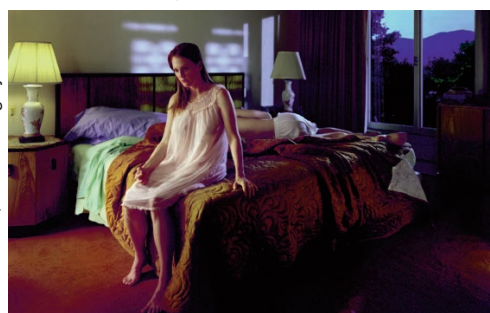

M&D arte opened in the Milan region in 2011, with an inaugural exhibition devoted to Italian art since the 1950s. Recognising the vast potential of photography, the gallery quickly came to represent a selection of some of the genre's most internationally-renowned artists.

Established in Paris's Odeon district in 2010, this gallery and bookshop features a rich selection of works, focusing on photography and, in particular, work by Japanese photographers. The space abounds with rare objects and curios, presenting original editions, out-of-print books, old art journals, exhibitions catalogues and posters.

Solo show: Toshithugu Yamawaki

A self-taught artist, Toshithugu Yamawaki was born in Tokyo in 1956. An exhibition of his "Dual" series retraces the artist's practice over the last three decades. Inspired by painting and drawing, Yamawaki's photographs consider form and dimension, escaping the intelligible world to focus on perception itself.

A member of Paris's Carré Rive Gauche, Hegoa has represented a selection of established Contemporary artists since 2009, whilst also working to promote emerging talents. A significant portion of its programme is devoted to work by photographers and sculptors, united by their focus on evasion, freedom and sincerity.

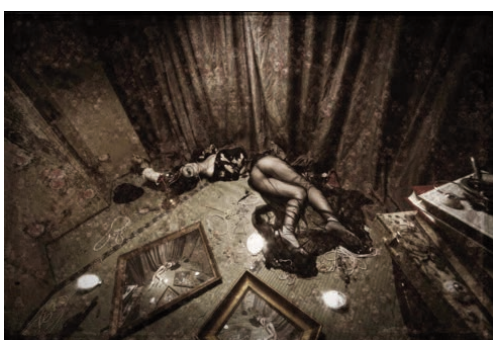

Gallery Maison d'art, Japan, Osaka

Launched in 1997, Maison d'art has been in Osaka since 2003. The gallery represents principally Japanese artists whose work presents a unique vision, related as much to the contemporary as to the traditional Japanese aesthetic. Since 2005, their Paris offices have regularly organised collective exhibitions of work by both Japanese and French artists, established or emerging, whose status is growing in the West as well as the East.

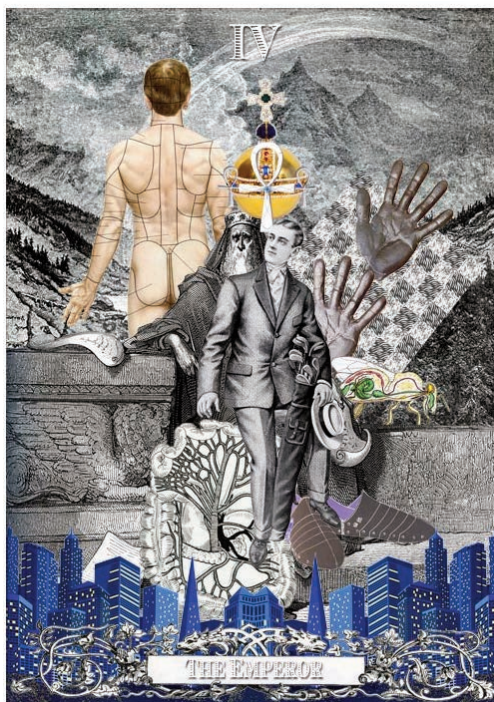

Stephen Cohen, USA, Los Angeles

Stephen Cohen Gallery opened in 1992 and has ever since been exhibiting both vintage and contemporary photography. The gallery champions American photography and has largely contributed to the recognition of photography as a true art in itself. Stephen Cohen is the founder of the oldest photo fair, photo L.A., which has run for 24 years.

Sixty One Gallery, The Netherlands, Amsterdam

For the last seven years, Sixty One Gallery has represented contemporary Dutch and international artists, providing them with the opportunity to exhibit in Amsterdam, one of the capitals of contemporary art.

Solo show: Inga Krymskaya

Russian artist Inga Krymskaya incorporates icons and symbols into her work, bringing us into a universe which is at once very personal yet also informal, where nothing seems to be in its proper place. Her work also includes a strong element of social commentary.

Caroline Smulders, Paris

Caroline Smulders represents around a dozen artists who are regularly exhibited throughout the year in France or abroad, with whom she works on specific projects linked to the French territory. Existing as an office, laboratory, and living space since 2008, the Caroline Smulders showrooms on Rue Martel stand apart from the more traditional galleries.

Solo show: Gerard Malanga

Born in New York in 1945, the poet, photographer and filmmaker Gerard Malanga had a huge influence on the Factory, where he photographed superstars including Andy Warhol, Nico and Candy Darling, playing witness to the underground New York scene during the 1960s. In commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the Factory he will be in Paris, fotofever is honoured to welcome the artist, whilst the Maison Européenne de la Photographie will organise a conference with Malanga.

Nue galerie, Pantin

Nue galerie opened in 2013 on the outskirts of Paris in Pantin. Located in a former factory building, the gallery is dedicated to the visual arts with an emphasis on photography. The gallery presents a generation of subversive artists, originating from France and elsewhere, whose art explores the body in all its forms as a medium for statements and questioning.
